WBTA YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP

The WBTA Youth Scholarship program is open to juniors or seniors in high school and freshmen and sophomores in college. The \$1,000 award may be used for equestrian education, such as training, clinics or college equestrian team dues. Applicants are judged on several criteria: an essay describing what they would do with the award, academic performance, a trainer's letter of recommendation and participation in our organization. Our inaugural winner was Elizabeth Stephan, who goes by the nickname Betsy. She began riding at the age of eight, when she first attended a horse riding camp. Soon after, she began showing at WBTA in 2000 with her first pony, Shakespeare, who ended up winning Short Stirrup Grand Champion that year. Since then, Betsy has owned numerous horses and ponies, and has ridden other people's horses as well. She has owned her current mount, Allegría, since she was a foal and has done all the work to make her a show hunter, from showing on the line, to under saddle, to her first year at three foot this year.

Betsy currently attends Towson University, where she is a Biology major with a Chemistry minor, with the aspiration to go to veterinary school. She is planning to graduate at the end of her third year. Betsy works all week at school then comes home on the weekends to ride and show, as well as braid and clip horses for others.

WBTA RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. WBTA is a membership organization with horse shows open to all. Regular Individual memberships, either Junior or Senior, are \$35.00 per show season; Regular Family memberships (any member of the immediate family residing at the same address) are \$45.00. Only WBTA Regular Members are eligible to receive year-end awards. For points to count toward year-end awards, riders must join WBTA before competing. Entry fees are \$15.00 per class; \$10.00 per class for WBTA Regular Members.
3. Stallions are barred from any class in which a Junior is specified to ride.
4. No martingales are allowed in Under Saddle classes except for classes held in Ring A.
5. Scratches and adds must be made at the Horse Show Office prior to the start of a division.
6. In Jumper classes, ties except for first are decided by the best time in the first round. Jump order may be established by reverse order of entries received.
7. WASHINGTON BRIDLE TRAILS ASSOCIATION HORSE SHOW and the WASHINGTON BRIDLE TRAILS ASSOCIATION will not be responsible in any way for loss, or damage to any person, animal, property or equipment, and each exhibitor shall assume all liability and hold harmless the WASHINGTON BRIDLE TRAILS ASSOCIATION HORSE SHOW and the WASHINGTON BRIDLE TRAILS ASSOCIATION for any loss, damage or injury to any person, animal, property or equipment that may be caused by any horse or pony entered by them or due to the carelessness or negligence of the person or persons in charge of such horse or pony, or any of their subordinates or superiors.
8. When mounted, all exhibitors must appear in proper attire with ASTM/SEI approved headgear. No one will be allowed in the ring during judging unless on official business.
9. Judges' decisions are final in all events.
10. Park Service regulations prohibit public address announcements before 9:00 a.m. All exhibitors shall have the responsibility for prompt and timely appearance at class time.
11. Management reserves the right to decline any entry and to return any entry fee before or during the show without being liable for compensation. Should any question or dispute arise that is not provided for in the rules, the same shall be referred to management, whose decision shall be final. 10 minute calls, once announced, will be enforced.
12. All prize money will be paid through the show office. Please allow 45 minutes after completion of class for prize money to be credited. All prize money in excess of balances due will be mailed to the owner of record, unless otherwise directed, within 30 days after completion of the show.
13. Controlled schooling is allowed in the hunter rings from 6:30 until 8:00 a.m. The jumper ring is closed until first course walk at 9:00 a.m. No longeing is allowed in the rings or schooling area. Poling is not allowed.
14. Dogs are not allowed on the show grounds. Dog owners are subject to a \$50 fine for dogs on show grounds.
15. Classes offered are those listed in the time schedule. Diagrams of courses will be posted in the respective in-gate areas one hour before each class, unless specifications state otherwise. Diagrams will be labeled with corresponding class numbers.
16. All vehicles must park in designated areas. NO CAR PARKING in designated trailer areas.

DIRECTIONS

Eastbound on the Capital Beltway (Route 495)

From the Beltway, exit south onto Connecticut Avenue. Go to East-West Highway (Route 410) and turn left. Go to the second traffic light and turn right onto Meadowbrook Lane. Rings are located directly behind the barn.

Westbound on the Capital Beltway (Route 495)

From the Beltway, exit south onto Georgia Avenue. Bear right at the second traffic light, following signs to 16th Street. Take 16th Street to the second traffic light and turn right onto East-West Highway (Route 410). Go to the fourth traffic light (at the bottom of a long hill) and turn left onto Meadowbrook Lane. Rings are located directly behind the barn.

Parking

Plenty of parking is available for both cars and trailers. Parking is on a first-come first-serve basis, with one minor exception: we reserve the few larger spaces behind the utility barn for big rig parking. With cooperation, there is room for four rigs in this area. All other trailers must park in the field north of the barn. Please use designated manure receptacles. **PLEASE DO NOT DUMP MANURE IN THE NORTH FIELD.** There are two designated car parking areas: one near the barn and the other in the Park Service storage lot. There are volunteers on hand in the early morning to direct traffic and answer any questions.

For the sake of Meadowbrook neighbors (and to avoid parking tickets), please remember that parking on the streets is strictly prohibited.

YEAR-END CHAMPIONSHIPS

Year-end Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion trophies, as well as ribbons through sixth place, are awarded in each division. Hunter and Pleasure year-end championships are awarded to mounts accumulating the most points. Equitation year-end championships are awarded to riders accumulating the most points. Riders must be members of WBTA before entering the show for points to count. A minimum of 5 points must be earned towards year-end awards. Both Amateur and Professional riders also earn points toward individual high-point awards. Points earned by a rider on a mount ineligible for year-end awards do not count toward the High-Point Junior Rider or the Adult Amateur Rider awards. MHSA- and VHSA-designated classes and divisions do not count towards year-end championships.

High-Point Young Rider: High-point rider from Mini-Stirrup, Short Stirrup, Pre-Short Stirrup, Long Stirrup or Young Horsemanship.

High-Point Junior Rider: High-point Junior rider from all hunter, jumper, and Junior equitation divisions.

High-Point Adult Amateur Rider: High-point Adult Amateur rider from all hunter, jumper, and adult equitation divisions.

High-Point Professional Rider: High-point Professional rider from all divisions.

High-Point Hunter: High-point mount from all hunter divisions.

High-Point Jumper: High-point mount from all jumper divisions.

High-Point Equitation: High-point rider from Pre-Children's Equitation, Pony Equitation, Horse Equitation, Modified Children's Equitation, Pre-Adult Equitation, Modified Adult Equitation or Adult Amateur Equitation.

High-Point Pleasure: High-point mount from a single pleasure division.

YEAR-END SPORTSMANSHIP AWARDS

Three Sportsmanship Awards are presented at the Annual Banquet: the Claude E. White Memorial Trophy for a Junior rider, the James B. Edson Memorial Trophy for an Adult rider, and the Rest Assured Memorial Trophy for a distinguished horse or pony. In addition, the Bobo Memorial Trophy is presented for service to WBTA and the Helping Hand Award, the Ann Maffry Memorial Trophy, is presented to a parent.

AWARDS—DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS

Eight ribbons are awarded in each class. Points are as follows: 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, .5.

Daily Division Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons, as well as a championship trophy, are awarded in the following Hunter Divisions. (Only the four mounts with the most points over fences are considered for the daily titles, and their points for ribbons won in flat classes count. In the event of a tie for Champion or Reserve Champion, the title is awarded to the mount with the most points over fences.)

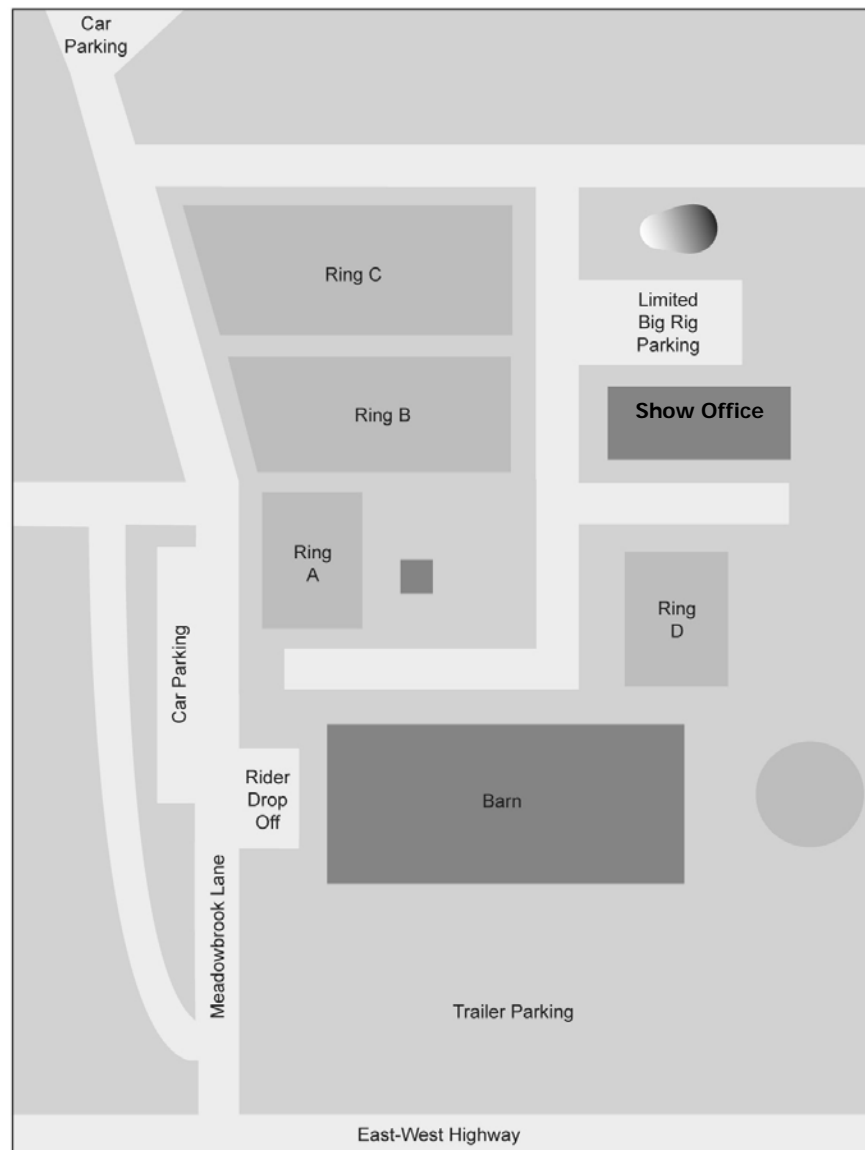

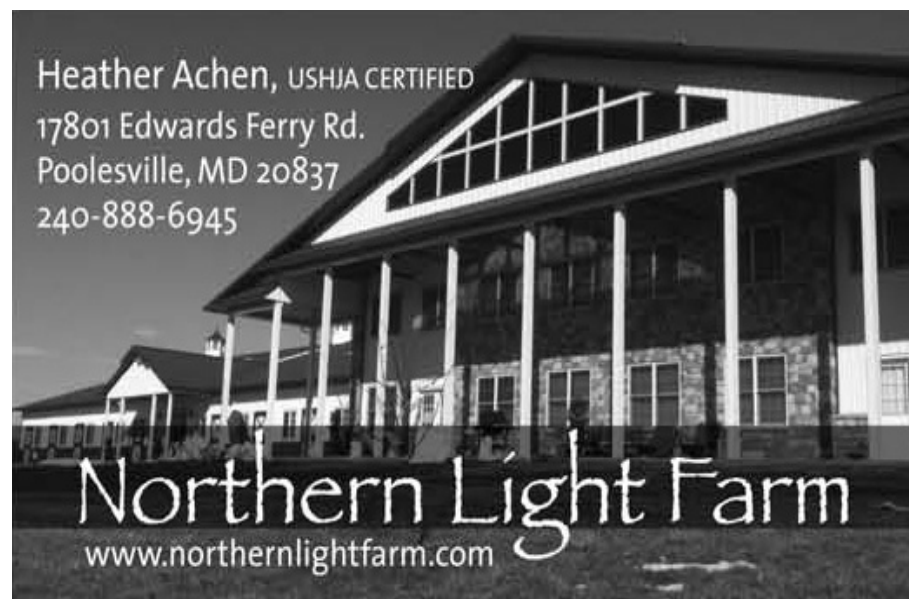

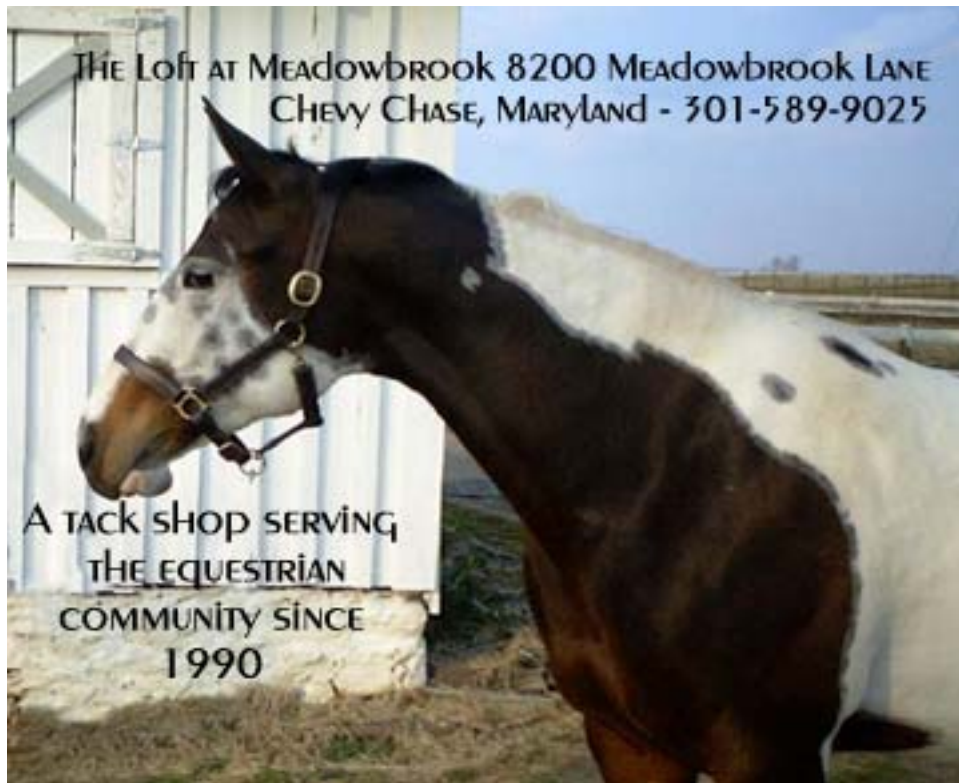

I understand that all junior riders are required to wear ASTM/SEI Certified helmets when mounted and all senior riders are required to wear ASTM/SEI certified helmets when jumping, but I understand that no amount of protective equipment can guard against all injuries.
